

Motion for the Determination of Membership Fees for 2022/23

The Management Committee propose that the New Zealand Branch Service Fee for 2022/23 for an Adult Single Member be \$55. The Society Subscription (expressed in pounds) will be that set by the Society at its AGM in November 2021, the Management Committee will determine in July 2022 what that amount will be when converted into NZ\$. This will be a close conversion, the movement in the exchange rate between July 2022 and when the funds are remitted to the Society (in late September or early October 2022) will be managed through the Subscriptions bank account.

The fees for other membership categories will be calculated as per the table below:

* Only one Joint Member may be registered in association with any other Joint or fee paying Member in a household. Both should be registered as Adult Joint

** Both members should be registered as Adult Joint Email, only one will receive publications sent by email

*** Half Year membership is available to new members joining after 1 January 2022. The fee is 50% of the fee for Adult Single membership for the relevant membership year. It is not available to lapsed members re-joining.

Rationale:

We are again setting the Membership Fees for a period starting well into the future at a time of uncertainty. As was done for 2020/21, the Management Committee are able to “waive” part of the Branch fee and will do this if it is appropriate.

Setting the Branch Fee specifically is a change in method, it allows the Branch to know what the likely income will be in the future and gives clarity at the time of approval about how much will be going to the Branch. It will also give the Membership a clearer view of future Branch income and what their priorities are for its use.

In July the Management Committee will determine a close approximation of the RSCDS Subscription figure when converted into NZ\$. The Subscriptions Fund will be used to manage any movements in the exchange rate between then and the funds being sent to HQ. "Overs and unders" will be adjusted the following year. Thus Members will pay each year an amount close to that that they would pay if they paid their subscription directly to HQ.

At the Society AGM held on 6 November 2021 a Motion to increase the Adult Single Subscription to £25 was passed (this is an increase from £18 which was a short-term decrease from £20). The initial indicative figures provided, based on the £18, have therefore been revised (using the exchange rate at 20 November of 0.519) and are as follows:

This illustrates the importance of setting the Branch Fee independently – being committed a year out to a decrease in Branch income of \$13 per member because of a change in Society Subscriptions would be difficult for Branch decision making.

Acceptance of this part of the Notice of Motion applies for the next financial year (1 September 2022 to 31 August 2023) and will be reflected in the budget tabled for approval at the next Annual General Meeting (expected to be 1 January 2023).

Rationale:

Part A.

It has been a standard practice of New Zealand Branch for some years to recognise the significant contribution made by the Treasurer and Secretary by allowing for annual honoraria.

The Review of Payments conducted by the Branch in 2016 concluded that these two payments are appropriate and are not out of line with other voluntary organisations of a similar nature. The amount of each Honorarium has not changed since the 2016 review.

Part B.

The Branch, like the rest of the world, is in a state of change and different ways of working are creating opportunities for different ways of meeting and working. While the committee meetings mentioned in this rationale could be held differently when the time comes, this Notice of Motion retains for the 2022/23 School authorisation to reimburse in the same way as in recent years. While the Branch is adapting to the changed world, for the next Summer School the current practices are still relevant and especially needed as the Branch identifies what processes and practices are needed for the changed world.

Management Committee members are expected to attend committee meetings from 27 December to 2 January, and the AGM. An additional meeting can also be scheduled on 3 January for business carried over from prior meetings. They are also expected to be available to interact with members and to attend evening functions over the course of the School

Many roles on the Committee have additional commitments during the School, including interaction with and support of Summer School organisers, finalising arrangements for AGM, meeting with co-ordinators of branch activities such as shops, preparation for upcoming meetings and identification of future concerns of Branch members which often only become apparent through serendipitous interaction that occurs at Summer School.

The 2016 Review of Payments recommended that the Management Committee present for approval at the AGM a recommendation as to who is entitled to have all/part of their Summer School accommodation paid. The recommendation since has been that all Management Committee members are entitled to have their accommodation (ie the non-dancing Summer School fee) paid.

By approving expenditure for accommodation and meals for the 2022/23 Summer School now, Management Committee members will have certainty about the expenses they will personally incur in attending Committee meetings over the 2022/23 summer period.

The key rationale for this motion is founded on the value that can be obtained through face-to-face interaction – within Management Committee and between Management Committee and branch members. With reduced opportunity to interact during the year, face-to-face interaction at events such as Summer School is perhaps more important at this and the 2022/23 school than it has even been.



Rationale:
